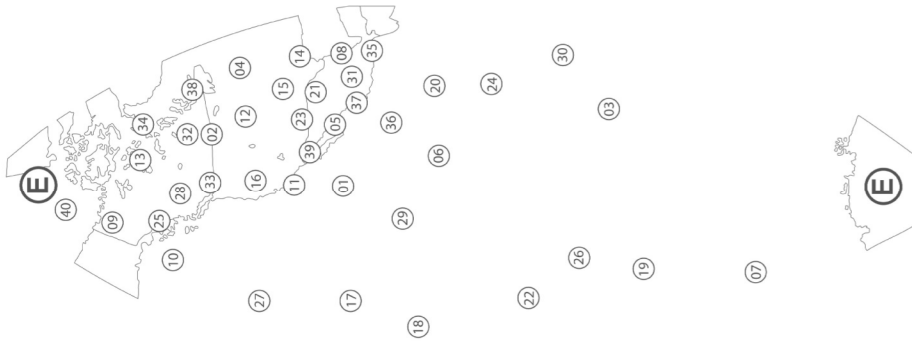
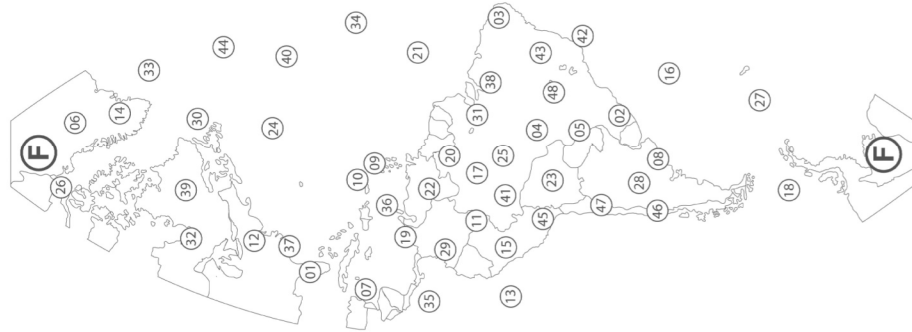

IDEAS FOR GAMES

Around the globe : (2 players minimum).

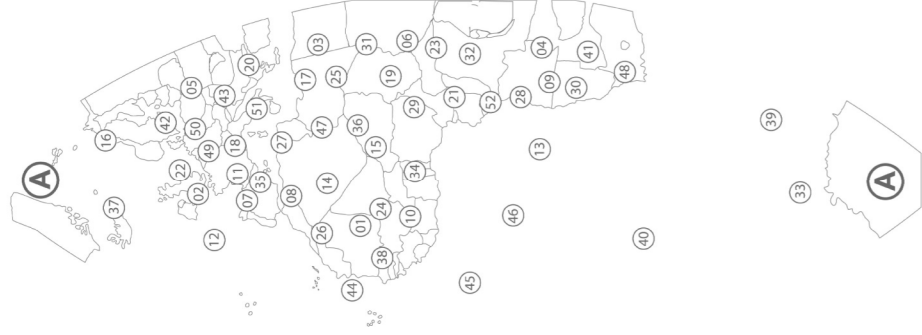
The children form a circle (if there are only two players, they can form a line). One child goes in the middle of the circle. The youngest of the players on the outside of the circle picks up the globe and throws it to the person in the middle. When they catch it, they must keep their hands in the same position on the globe, so that the globe doesn't move. The person holding the globe must then think up a question about the continent, country, animals, capital city, ocean, sea, border, meridian... that they are touching with their hands, and ask this question to the person who threw them the globe. If the question is answered correctly the player wins a point and takes the place of the person in the middle of the circle. Then the next player throws the globe to the player in the middle. The game is played in a clockwise direction and the first player to get 3 points wins !

Keep away from the globe : (4 players minimum).

This game is based on the classic game "dodgeball". Children get into two teams in a well-defined area divided into two equal parts. Both teams throw the globe, aiming to hit a player on the other team :

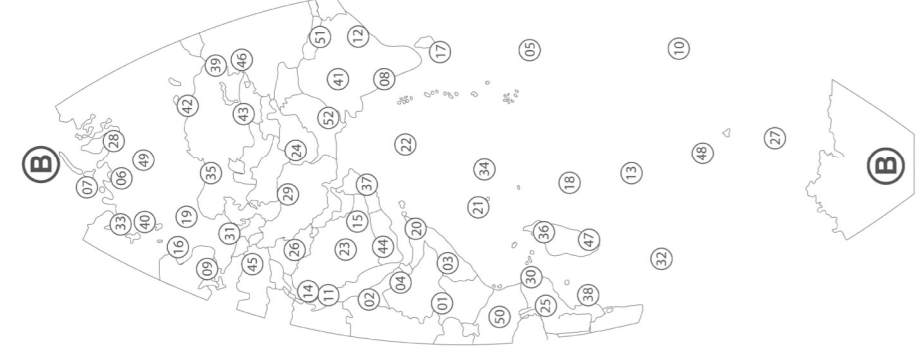
- if the globe doesn't hit any player and falls outside the other team's designated area, the ball continues to be thrown as before.
- If a player on the other team gets the ball (within the designated area) this player then throws the ball back to the person who threw it at them, who must then ask them a question about the area of the globe in which their hands are positioned. If the player responds correctly to the question, they win a point for their team. If the answer is wrong, the game continues as before.
- If the globe falls to the ground on the other team's designated area and no member of the other team gets it, the team that threw the ball is given the chance to answer a question about the globe and wins a point. The first team that gets 5 points wins !
